

CAMP RULES

1. Girls are not allowed in boys' cabins. Boys are not allowed in girls' cabins. No camper is to enter a cabin other than his or her own without a counselor being present.
2. **Pranks and practical jokes will not be tolerated!** The property does not belong to the Oklahoma Assembly of the Church of God. Careless or intentional destruction of camp property may result in expulsion from camp and/or payment for replacement or repair of property by the camper.
3. Swimwear **must be modest.** Bikini type bathing suits are not permitted. The same principle applies to one-piece suits that are low cut in the front or are high cut on the hips that are immodest. Boxer type cutoffs for guys, no race-type trunks. If your swimming suit is inappropriate, you will be asked to change or swimming privileges will be taken away.
4. There will be a lifeguard on duty during swim times. **No one is to swim unless the lifeguard is present.** The lifeguard has full authority to remove anyone from the swim area.
5. **All medication,** including over-the-counter medicine needs to be turned into the camp nurse at registration. If you have young people who are on medications, have them turn them into you before coming to registration. Please send all medications in the original pharmacy bottles or packaging with specific instructions as to correct dosing for your child. **Please no loose pills in baggies or envelopes.**
6. All in attendance should wear proper clothing for outdoor camping. Shoes must be worn at all times due to the rough terrain. Modest length (mid-thigh) shorts may be worn. There should be no bare midriffs, nor bare feet (except at the swim area), no mini-skirts, no short jean skirts, and no strapless clothing. Outer clothing should conceal under clothing. If you are inappropriately dressed, you will be asked by a counselor, director, or CE Representative to change into something suitable.
7. Inappropriate behavior between the opposite sexes will not be permitted.
8. Individual camp curfews and lights out rules will be enforced and may vary from camp to camp. Your Camp Director will set these times.
9. ALL guests to the camp must register with the Camp Director upon arrival. They are allowed to participate in the services only and must leave the grounds by 9:00 P.M. Guests may only participate in mealtimes if approved by the Oakridge Staff. There is a limited amount prepared for meals, and the campers, counselors, & staff must be fed first. Guests may be asked to leave at the Directors' or CE Representatives' discretion. Guests that are 18 years of age or younger must be accompanied by an adult.
10. No electronics of any kind will be allowed. No radios, walkman-type stereos, iPods, TVs, tape recorders, CD players, cell phones, walkie-talkies, or electronic games are allowed. For safety, there will be no knives, hatchets, fireworks, or guns allowed. Directors, counselors, and staff are allowed to use cell phones, pagers, etc.
11. Possession or use of tobacco, alcohol, and illicit drugs of any kind will not be tolerated.
